Medal of Honor: The White House announced the Medal of Honor will be awarded posthumously to Air Force Chief Master Sgt. Richard Etchberger on September 21. While stationed at Phoc Pha Thi, known as Lima Site 85, which was a secret radar base in the neutral country of Laos, saved the lives of 3 fellow soldiers on March 11, 1968. He was nominated for the MOH at that time but was denied by President Johnson since the event happen at a secret base in Laos.

Near misses cause only superficial damage to the cruiser. Higbee lost its 5 inch mount (turret). Even if you did not get the answer, you are still a winner and deserve the free dinner.
