The pledge of allegiance was said. David Samuels presided. The meeting was held at the Sawmill Tap Room.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the secretary's minutes as published. The treasurer's report on motion made, seconded and passed was accepted as read. Bob K. collected 2020 dues from 16 members. In 2019 there were 18 paid members.

I am unaware of an "alert situation" but that doesn't mean there wasn't a situation. It is required that someone at the event have a copy of the permit on them for just such instances (I'll be bringing to April event.) Please keep in mind, that even if you have a date permitted and a special situation arises that might make it unsafe for you to be there, the officer would direct you to leave the premises as the safety of the public is of the utmost importance. President David Samuels,

Thank you for reaching out to me about the issues that transpired with Cary VFW Post 7383; however, this matter is solely between the NCVII and Post 7383. Post 7383 is made up of members from every war and even pay for the Life Memberships of Korean War and later veterans when they join so this does not appear to be a slight at Vietnam Veterans at all which your letter suggests.

Due to this being an issue between your organization and Post 7383, the Department of North Carolina VFW will not be getting involved with this matter. After speaking to Post Commander David Wagoner, he confirmed to me that many members of your organization are also members of VFW Post 7383, like your letter states, and that your members may appeal this ruling on the Post floor at a regular meeting. They meet on the third Tuesday of every month. I would suggest that if you would like to take this grievance any further, that is the route you take. Thank you again for letting me know and I wish you the best in working something out with Post 7383.
