POW/MIA Ceremonies:

If it's in the spring, there is not time to meet the scholarship deadline. It was noted that semesters start in September and January and the deadline is April. As an aside, Dave Samuels mentioned the Helicopter Association is working with the N.C. National Guard to place their helicopters in a building they are constructing near the airport.

Bonnie (and the Dixons, Del Vecchio, Val Price and Steve Hensley) went to the Tet event at Dorton Arena sponsored by the Vietnamese Community. It was a spectacular event with martial arts demonstrations, dances, songs, and poetry. At that event scholarships were given to grade and high school students. It was suggested that more of us try to go.

Bo listed upcoming events at the Elks:

1. The VA is sponsoring an event at the Elks where they give guitar lessons to veterans.

Must qualify for the program through the VA Hospital.

2. On March 7 DAP for Homeless Veterans at Durham Athletic Park. Elks will be assisting VA with this program.

3. Wake County has approved a new veterans home in Raleigh. Date of completion is approximately 2021. It will be built off of Blue Ridge Road.

Old Business:

Audit: Dave Samuels will contact Val Price about auditing our books.

Bo Williams reported that **Project Healing Waters** event was up and running. Had 20 participants.

Further discussion was had on presenting a plaque to Tam Van Cao and Bich Nga Loung. It was decided to give a scholarship to a Vietnamese student in their honor in addition to the plaque making them honorary members for all their work for NCVVI.

VFW and NCVVI Relationship: A letter was sent to the State Commander of the VFW with a copy to the Cary VFW. As of this date, there was no response. It was decided to wait another month and if no response taking it to the next step.

Meeting was adjourned. Everyone is agreeable with having meetings at a restaurant.
