The minutes as sent and the treasurer's report as given by Bonnie Kuhr in Bob Krzynowek's absence were approved by motion made, seconded and passed.

Education:

- Bob encouraged everyone to go into the schools to speak now that the second semester has begun. (A list of schools was sent to all after the meeting.)
- Later in the spring Jim Bahm will be retiring. Jim's twin boys are seniors and Jim will cross the stage with them at graduation. Bob Matthews proposed something special for Jim other than a pat on the back and a plaque either in May or June in front of the whole faculty. Bob will bring ideas for the event to the next meeting. Bob received an email asking him what's going to happen to education leadership when he leaves. He assures us that he will remain with us albeit by long distance. However, he hopes someone will step up to handle education. This will be discussed at February meeting.
- Joe Harsch asked when the Education Committee was going to add Gulf War, Desert Storm, Iraq and Afghanistan vets. Bob Matthews noted that we have tried to get speakers from that group but they don't want to go into the schools. All we can do is encourage this group. However, the NCVVI charter says we have to be Vietnam vets.
- The next convention is in San Francisco next November. The D.C. convention was very successful. Had several returnees. They had a good-sized crowd with lots of interest

Update on Etchings in Stone:
