Bud Gross opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance. Guest Johnny Ray spoke about his work as Director, Proud Volunteer, Operation North State. This group brings vets together for fishing trips, etc. The next event where volunteers are needed will be at Jordan Lake on the last Friday of September. It was suggested NCVVI do a casino with proceeds going to Operation North State.

The minutes were approved as sent and the treasurer's report as read.

Education: Bob Matthews reported there will be 9 teachers teaching the full course on Vietnam in 17 high schools. Abby Stotzenberger is working on a trip to Vietnam for teachers. There will be a need for three people to go as chaperones in the spring of next year during the school year. Bob Matthews will be going. Funding is through the schools and teachers. Our sponsorship is in name only but we are putting the program together. A motion was made, seconded and passed that we participate in name only but put the program together.

NCVVI is looking at a workshop for teachers with a showing of Etching in Stones which will be broken down to a 45 minute capsule. It will be held this fall at the Museum probably on a Saturday morning. A packet will be go out about the workshop requesting an RSVP. Teachers outside of the area will be invited. Schools open on August 29. Twenty-eight high schools will have a unit on Vietnam.

NCVVI will be going to the national conference in D.C. on December 3, 4 and 5.

Etchings in Stone: Bob made contact with an expert on projectors at SAS. SAS would like to help us out and we are hoping they will donate. As for showing the video, Joe Harsch will be visiting the Community College to see if they will do; Bob has talked to the Elks. VVA Smithfield and the Elks both gave us \$500 so there should not be a charge.

Replacement of Treasurer: Bud Gross will be moving to Tennessee. Bob Krzynowek agreed to replace Bud.

Management of Scholarship: Bob Matthews and Bonnie Kuhr will try to replace Bud. A motion was made, seconded and passed that Bob Matthews and Bonnie Kuhr replace Bud Gross in the management of the scholarship.

Creation of Veterans Service Officer: The idea is to have a designated person to whom anyone with problems, especially financial, could go. Bo Williams has volunteered to be that person. Information should be given to Bo. If the need is \$200, Bo would go to the board. If it is more, membership would have to approve. Mike Lynch mentioned that the Army has an emergency fund that helps those in need. He will check if the Army could help.

Group Activities: Ron Harris mentioned two possible activities—one a trip to D.C. on Veterans Day or a bus trip to Patriot Point, South Carolina. November 8 is Election Day and Veterans Day is November 11. The group agreed Patriot Point is the trip of choice at this time. Ron Harris, Bo Williams and Bob Matthews will coordinate the trip and report back to the group.

Sign at the Memorial: Bill Dixon was trying to get the Capitol to put a "keep off" sign up at the statue. They informed the Capitol was not able to provide one. Discussed putting poles around the statue with a sign to keep off of the monument.

Cleaning of Monument: On September 10 a group of volunteers, under the supervision of NCVVI, will be cleaning the monument. NCVVI will furnish cleaning materials. The 4 hour shift will be from 9-1.

Armed Forces VN Network Reunion: There is a need for drivers. It will start September 30, doing POW ceremony on October 1 and leaving on Sunday. They will take a bus down to Ft. Bragg.
