From News and Observer: Jim and Tom Reece, brothers from Wilmington, have spent more than a decade seeking out photos of people from North Carolina who were killed during the war in Vietnam.

What began as a project to find Jim's high school classmates who died in the war grew over time to an effort to obtain photographs of all 1,931 soldiers, airmen, sailors and Marines on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial wall in Washington, D.C., who were either born, based or buried in North Carolina.

The photos appear on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund website, www.vvmf.org, along with thousands of others from around the country, and will be displayed in a planned education center near the wall along with some of the hundreds of thousands of objects left at the memorial over the years.

History of the Vietnam Memorial Bench

On Saturday, March 24, 1990, NCVVI members and volunteers met at the site of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial on the State Capitol grounds to have a hands on part in the completion of the NC Vietnam Veterans Memorial. The work started at 7:30 a.m. when veterans Joe Stallings and Chris Moore and volunteer Dan Register carefully removed vegetation (monkey grass) from the sight of the granite bench so it could be used later to relandscape the finished project. By 7:45 veterans and volunteers were showing up from all directions with shovels, rakes, picks, drop cords, water hose and almost any tool imaginable. By 9:00 we were about 20 men and women strong. We had hand dug the footing and hauled off three pickup trucks of soil leaving enough to back fill and landscape on the site. I think almost all of the volunteers had their hands on a shovel, pick or wheel barrel by now. I even saw Sam Townsend, Capitol Administrator, with a shovel in his hand.

By 10:00 the guys from F&R Engineering, Jimmy Gilchrist and Joe Morawski, had taken soil samples to test for compaction and inspected the footings. By 10:30 we had the rebar (steel) in place and tied. By 11:30 we had the job site cleaned up and all the tools loaded. We could not get the concrete delivered after 10:00 on Saturday, but Robert Eagle, Project Manager for Davidson and Jones Construction Company came to our rescue. He had a crew ready to pour the concrete for us first thing Monday morning, March 26.

On Saturday, March 31, we were rained out but we still had a dozen members and volunteers there to work. We decided to do our carpentry work on Wednesday evening, April 4. We started to work at 5:00 p.m. and worked until after 8:00. We had to quit because of darkness. Steve March furnished his hand tools and saws. Chris Moore, William Dixon and Dan Register were the carpenters and John Odom was our helper.

On April 7, Chris Moore, Dave Samuels and Jimmy Gilchrist poured the concrete for the bench pedestal. The bench top is expected to be installed by the middle of May with a formal dedication on the Fourth of July.

The concrete, rebar (steel), digging of footings, plywood, 2 x 4.5, nails, labor, etc. would have cost \$2760 but thanks to our veterans and supporters we spent a grand total of \$321.35. That's a savings of \$2438.65. We still need volunteers to backfill behind the bench and replant the monkey grass.
