It was confirmed that we will be doing a casino night for a group of insurance adjusters on Thursday, December 6th at the Crabtree Holiday Inn. Setup starts at 5 p.m.

Another casino night has been arranged with the Elks Lodge on a joint basis. It will be held in February.

Plans for our candlelight ceremony are a go. It is to be held at the Vietnam Memorial on Sunday, December 16th at 6 p.m. Setup is at 5 p.m.

Bert Rosefield gave a report on a hospice project. Veterans who are hospice patients are paired up with veteran companions to be with them in the end-stages of life.

It was announced that Steve Acai had donated all of the money to pay for the new flag poles. Steve will later have a plaque affixed to each pole with a dedication to someone who has been special in his life.
