Ron Harris opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance. Lonnie \mathbb{C} onners was welcomed back after a medical absence.

The minutes were approved as sent and the treasurer's report as read.

Education: Bob encouraged everyone to go into the schools to speak. Members may be getting an email from a student to set up an interview. Last month it was reported that the trip to Vietnam was put on hold due to lack of interest. It seems there is renewed interest in a spring trip to Vietnam by educators. Bill Dixon, Joe Harsch and Bob Matthews are hoping to speak to at least 100 teachers at the National Convention on Saturday, December 3, at 1:30. Bob received a request to speak to a Charter School junior class in Chapel Hill. Anyone interested in doing this should let Bob know. Joe Harsch met a teacher who asked if NCVVI would go into an elementary school to talk about Vietnam. Maybe some NCVVI members could go to the school and bring a lesson plan.

Scholarship Topics: Bob has received six so far. Let Bonnie Kuhr or **B**ob Matthews know of any scholarship subjects.

Update on Etchings in Stone: Bob Matthews and Ron Harris talked with SAS contact Louis; they are interested in helping us. SAS saved us \$300 for a projector, 5x8 screen and two blue tooth speakers. The cost to NCVVI will be \$900. Ron will be meeting with Louis to get a lesson on how to run the equipment. The lesson is open to anyone who would like to know how to run the machine. We will then be ready to show Etchings. It lasts 90 minutes. There will be no charge but donations will be accepted. Ron is working on a card to hand out about showing Etchings in Stone.

Ron had the first showing for 85 residents at Sears Stone Retirement Center which was well received. Bill Dixon had the 31 panels there, Ron the diorama and Amnon a jeep. Joe Harsch showed it to one individual. He has one scheduled for January 17 at a church and the VVA will be scheduled sometime in the future. The Vet Center wants to see it.
