The pledge of allegiance was said. David Samuels presided. The meeting was again held at Baileywick Park due to COVID-19.

Under the Weather: Our thoughts go out to Ron Harris, Joe Harsch and Linda Odom.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the secretary's minutes as sent. The treasurer's report on motion made, seconded and passed was accepted as read.

It was announced that we have a new member. Robert Nixon, Vietnam Vet, from Burlington, has joined NCVVI. We hope he can attend one of the meetings.

POW/MIA Ceremonies: Monica Cash will continue live streaming.

October 3: The American Legion Riders joined the ceremony. It was held at the Vietnam monument as the Capitol was open. There was no problem with the huge crowd. George Young of the Riders reported the event "went fine".

Ron Harris had suggested everything be moved out of the Museum in case things were shut down again. Since there is no other place to store the equipment, it was decided to keep the items in the Museum. Benny Hoots has the Missing Man Table. The flags had previously been stored in the Capitol building, but the Capitol may not be accessible because of COVID-19. As for the dirt in the flag pole holes, two were found. It was suggested painting the grass when and where they are located. The electrician said there is no repair date on the calendar for the faulty electricity. Bill Dixon said he was assured there was power available at the old place by the light pole.

In addition, NCVVI received a letter asking for a donation for the MMIA Troops Golf Classic: \$500 US flag sponsor, \$250 Purple Heart sponsor, \$100 Friend of the Tee-Off. Due to lack of means of income, it was decided not to donate to Troops Golf Classic.

This is the website: <u>SSN777Club-newsletter-13-Oct2020.pdf.</u>FYI: USS North Carolina (SSN-777), a Virginia-class attack submarine, is the fourth ship of the United States Navy named for the 12th U.S. state. The contract to build her was awarded to Northrop Grumman Newport News on 30 September 1998 and her keel was laid down on 24 May 2004. She was launched on 5 May 2007.
