Minutes Tuesday, September 22, 2015



Attending: Angelo Carmen, Bud Gross, Bo Williams, Ron Harris, Bob Matthews, Joe Harsch, Ron Fitzsimmons, Paul White, Dennis Abels, Steve Henley, Dave Samuels, and Bonnie Kuhr

Meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance. A motion was made, seconded and unanimously passed to accept the secretary's minutes as sent by email and the treasurer's report as presented. Joe Harsch turned over to the treasurer a check for \$200 from the Smithfield VVA to be used as part of the NCVVI scholarship for our student in Vietnam.

Dave Samuels reported on the casino night in Garner. He thought it was the best one yet with over 90 participants. Had the bare minimum of workers but it all worked out. If they ask us again, the vote around the room was we would do it. Bill Dixon also had a request for a casino for some realtors but it was too soon to organize so NCVVI declined.

Education: Bob Matthews reported that nine high schools are teaching Lessons of Vietnam and there may be two more schools teaching the course. The schools are: Apex, Cary, Sanderson, Millbrook, Athens Drive, S.E. Raleigh, Garner, Holly Springs and Wakefield. He will be getting shortly the list of schools, the names of the teachers, and the times and semesters teachers will be teaching.

Bob Matthews has shirts and bracelets. Bob announced he is resigning as co-host of NCVVI's TV show. So far there are 60 shows. Bill Dixon would like to continue these programs if NCVVI endorses. If anyone is interested in co-hosting, let Bob Matthews or Amnon know. The video of the Women in Vietnam symposium has not been received for showing on the TV show.

The teaching seminar is still on in New Orleans on November 11, 12 and 13. NCVVI allotted \$500 for the trip. Asked about the seminar, this is a national teachers convention. NCVVI is allotted a 2 hour slot to present Lessons on Vietnam. NCVVI members have visited 2,000 high schools in 31 states. The course is being taught in 2,000 high schools.

POW/MIA issue: The flag poles are in the ladies room at the Capitol and the flags are in Joe Harsch's truck. Joe requested that members get there early and stay to help get the poles and set up and then take them down and put away as it's too hard for one person. Joe Harsch has all of the equipment in

his truck which makes it hard for him to use said truck. Bud Gross agreed to take the equipment at the October meeting.
